BCTF - Members are very concerned about the new variant of COVID, Omicron, and the impact it will have on their teaching, students, and themselves. Teachers were given the week of January 3-7 to prepare a plan for the return of students.

HVAC in schools remains a top area of concern. Some districts have brought in portable HEPA filters, some are fully upgraded to MERV-13s, and others are still using MERV-8s. WorkSafeBC is being contacted to see if they will take action.

Mask compliance will likely continue to be a big issue. Tensions around who qualifies for an exemption and how they demonstrate that.

Some members have filed refusals of unsafe work which have resulted in a response from WorkSafeBC around changing rooms, rearranging furniture, etc.

BCFED OHS Centre – new Duty to Accommodate course now virtual. Planning women's OH&S course. Offering courses to ILWU. Technical Advisory Committee required for the Centre. Considering offering workplace coaching for joint committees.

ILWU – Working with employer on mandatory vaccine mandates (hardline or softer rollout?). Recognizing issue of unavailability of work clothes designed for women workers.

BCGEU – Office closed until January 17. Reopening dependent on PHO orders. Outbreaks reported at some worksites. In-person education on hold.

USW – Union met with ministers Eby and Bains to push for implementation of outstanding Helps report recommendations. Training on OH&S investigations for police and crown counsel. Continue to have some COVID issues in workplaces.

PSA – large union with many different components and good work being done in these. Appreciate the provincial info shared at this committee.

CUPW – COVID cases are increasing, rapid tests are available on voluntary basis. Employer will not provide workers with N95 respirators and government has not mandated.

UA170 – COVID infections are doubling, workers being sent home. Union is assisting with providing rapid tests.

BCFMWU – COVID infections are increasing, along with poor weather resulting in sailing cancellations.

PSAC – COVID infections increasing. Employer has asked workers to work from home. Continue to hold OH&S courses.

HSA- Union working on getting joint committees to function better.

FPSE – COVID plans being treated differently than K-12 sector. No mandatory vaccines. Staff and students afraid to return to campus. One local has been successful at lobbying for mandatory vaccines for staff and students. Students working in service industries at highest risk.

CEU – 100% staff vaccinated. One third of calls are COVID-related. Lots of inquiries from schools.

CUPE – Waiting for PHO to say get back to normal regarding COVID. Business as usual for schools K-12 with no mandatory N95s. Need more resources for ventilation. Good resource: Ryerson Tool Kit for chemical exposures.
